

## COURSE DROP COUNTER

The course drop counter maintains a running total of classes that an undergraduate degree-seeking student drops after the add/drop deadline (i.e., through the SIDA process). UF policy limits students to a maximum of four late drops, no more than two during the first 60 credits of enrollment at UF, and no more than two after completing 60 credits.

- W grades in a term from which the student withdrew display with **Withdrew** in the Reason column and are excluded from the limits.
- W grades in a term while enrolled as a non-degree student (that is, in any of the UNxxx programs) are not displayed and are excluded from the limits.
- If a student late drops both a class and an affiliated lab in the same semester, it counts as only one drop (if a class and lab are dropped late in two different semesters, they count as two drops).
- Transfer students are limited to two drops during their entire undergraduate program, and all late drops are counted in the Drops After 60 Credits limit.

**Note:** This page provides information that may be used when determining whether to allow a late drop request, but does not prevent the approval or processing of additional drops beyond the limits.

- **Current Status:** whether or not the student has used their quota of allowed drops (this message also displays on the SIDA request page)
  - You have two drops available prior to attempting 60 credits of enrollment at UF.
  - You have dropped one course (before 60 credits). A maximum of one additional course may be dropped during your first 60 credits of attempted enrollment at UF.
  - You have dropped two courses (before 60 credits). No additional drops allowed until the term after you have attempted 60 credits or more of enrollment at UF.

- You have two drops available after attempting 60 credits of enrollment at UF and prior to completing your undergraduate degree.
  - You have dropped one course (after 60 credits). A maximum of one additional course may be dropped prior to completing your undergraduate degree.
  - You have dropped two courses (after 60 credits). No additional drops allowed.
  - OLD Drop Policy – You are under the drop policy effective for prior to Summer B 2002.
- **Drops Prior to 60 Credits/Drops After 60 Credits:** number of late drops prior to completing 60 credits and after completing 60 credits
    - All late drops for transfer students are counted as Drops After 60 Credits
  - **Course List:** list of courses, by term, that were dropped late
    - If the course is from a withdrawn term, and thus not counted towards the limits, **Withdrew** appears in the Term Withdrawal column
    - If a lecture and affiliated lab are dropped late in the same semester, they count as one drop towards the limits.
